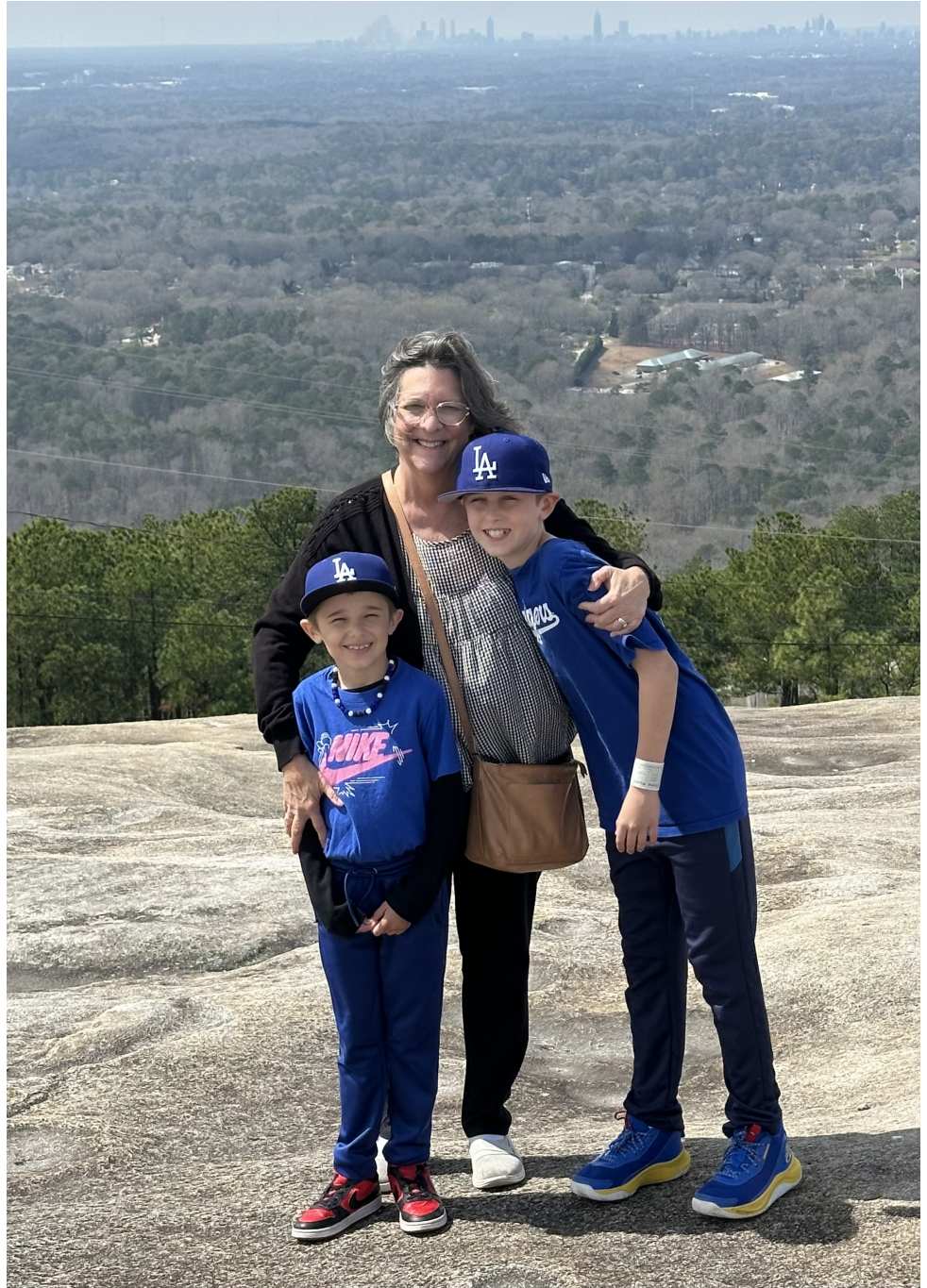
Location: USO, Hartsfield Airport
