This Week's Speaker: Jay Neal, Georgia Criminal Justice Coordinating Council

Jay Neal currently serves as the Executive Director for the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council. He was appointed to this position by **Governor Nathan Deal** in November of 2016. Director Neal formally served in the Georgia House of Representatives from 2004 until 2013, when he was appointed by Governor Deal to be the Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Transition, Support, and Reentry. Director Neal previously sat on the Board of Directors for the Lookout Mountain Fellowship of Christian Athletes, the SAGE Resource Center, and the YOBEL House. He and his wife, Gretchen, have two children and seven grandchildren, and they currently reside in Chickamauga, Georgia.



Last Week's Speaker: Joe Sarra, Georgia Advocacy Office

Leyla Compani presented Mr. Joe Sarra, MSW, of the Georgia Advocacy Office, Inc., a non-profit organization funded in 1977 by federal government mandated federal and private funding. Its purpose centers on assisting persons with intellectual and development disabilities, and their families. The GAO was put into law to protect persons with handicaps, countering past practices which actually made life harder for them, ridiculing them and keeping these citizens from mainstream living and self-improvement opportunities and supports. Since its inception, the GAO has, through federal legislation, an enlarged mission to strengthen the public's responsibilities while building the capacities of people with disabilities allowing greater societal benefit from their contributions. For example, the Help American Vote Act of 2002 provides education, training and assistance to individuals with disabilities to gain their full participation in the electoral process. Joe also explained that the "federal block grant" initiatives, such as is proposed for the Medicaid part of the Affordable Care Act, threatens GAO work as most assuredly its funds would be diverted because of the weaker political position persons with disabilities have. Joe also explained funding from GAO provides families with professional support that make it possible, less expensive and much more desirable for a disabled family member to live with his or her family, whereas without such assistance the family might not be able to do. Joe says "90%" of his time takes him to nursing facilities and with families to maximize awareness of service opportunities through the law. He notes disabled people want very much want to contribute but when in a nursing home, they may actually be blocked from more assistance and from learning of ways to help themselves and contribute, left literally to lying in a bed most of the time. The for-profit nursing system has no incentive to get their disabled clients out of the nursing home, back into their families' homes with supports, and in situations where they learn dependency-reducing skills.
