This Week's Speaker: Bailey Webb, Stream Realty

Bailey Webb joined Stream Realty Partners in 2015 as a Graphic Design Coordinator for Stream's Atlanta Office. She works collaboratively with the creative team to develop brand strategy and deliver design components to completion. In addition to brand development she is tasked with integrating innovation to further Stream's brand across the Atlanta market, including a beer garden project under development on the Beltline in her neighborhood, the West End.

Bailey attended the University of West Florida where she graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Graphic Design, a Minor in Communications Arts, and a Certificate in Sale's Management. Before leaving UWF, Bailey participated in the Department of Art's Art Gallery, and was awarded the Department of Arts Faculty Academic Excellence Award.

Last Week's Speaker: Bailey Webb, Stream Realty

President Elma asked Neil Shorthouse to present our speaker. Neil thanked Bailey Webb for agreeing - at the 'last minute' - to give some history about herself and her developing career. Bailey graduated from the University of West Florida in Pensacola FL and came to Atlanta with few plans in 2013. She took a job tending bar and for 11/2 years, saved her money and at the ripe old age of 24 was able to purchase her own home in October 2016 in the West End, becoming a growing number – at least four – of Club members owning West End homes. She accepted an internship with Stream Realty Partners, a commercial real estate services organization that specializes in leasing, sales, property and facilities management, headquartered in Dallas, TX; Stream has 750 employees, more than 100 clients with offices in 11 cities. Bailey is a graphic artist. She's on the marketing side of the company and creates all manner of products for branding, digital marketing, events, such as groundbreaking and signage – all to best portray Stream Realty Partners environments. Bailey was first introduced to AWER through Monday Night Brewery, a Stream tenant, who made a presentation to our Club last year. She was asked if she'd like to pursue membership, which she said she would, joining in RY2017. Bailey noted a special event on which she's working – an Urban Explorers Tour, which involves Stream's West End tenants touring offices and each taking ten minutes to pitch the nature of their businesses and work. This by-invitation event includes AWER's **Brent Brewer** as a journalist; Bailey can obtain invitations for a few other interested AWER members. Bailey was asked about her reception in the West End, which she reluctantly said was not totally cordial. Kimberly Carlisle said there are residents who are fearful of the community shifting as young professionals buy, as has she, **Danielle Carney** and Bailey. While race is a factor eliciting some trepidation and perhaps resentment, perhaps more to the point is gentrification. Regardless, the Club members congratulated Bailey on her successes and for her grace in committing herself to be a positive force as she builds her life to make important contributions to Atlanta and to Rotary. – Neil Shorthouse
